## ANDORRA

Andorra — Duty free fun in the Pyrenees

Andorra spells duty free — and what that means to the skier is the cheapest and liveliest apres-ski in Europe, where a glass of cognac costs about 20p, a three-course meal as little as £3 and you can go home at the end of your holiday with a car-price riddell under your arm.

But what about the skiing? Apart from low-cost tation and lift passes, Andorra prides itself on some of the best ski slopes in the Pyrenees, with the latest ski installations (and fewer queues) and well-maintained pistes. There's plenty of fun too, up to 100 sunny days in winter.

### Sun traps

Andorra is as far south as Rome. Tucked away in the mountains between France and Spain, the smallest country in Europe is surrounded by towering peaks. Its sheltered valleys face south to the Mediterranean and are natural sun traps.

Andorrans speak fluent French, Spanish and Catalan. The currency is pesetas (or francs, in true continental style), they know how to enjoy themselves. Their standard of living is high, yet the cost of living is low. Their country is a blend of old and new, quaint villages with Romanesque churches sit side-by-side with modern, purpose-built ski stations.

Andorra has one other main advantage for English-speaking skiers. Its instructors are British. Since all are BASI (British Association of Ski Instructors) qualified, the standard really is excellent. Not only are instructors expert skiers, they also know how to teach. Classes are small, too.

### Skiing at Arinsal

There are six excellent ski centres in

Andorra. Arinsal is one of the best. The resort has more than 24 km of runs. Twelve lifts take you to the slopes, which rise to 8,500 feet. Arinsal has plenty of fine, open skiing as well as mogul runs and good powder snow down through the woods. It's also possible to go high-altitude, glacier skiing by helicopter. Beginners are particularly well-served at Arinsal because the main slopes are high up — which means learning on good snow, not powder! The Arinsal lift pass also covers a second ski station at nearby Fal, which has seven lifts. However, Andorra is such a tiny country that all its ski resorts are within reach of the skier who wants to spend a day trying out different slopes. Soldeu is probably the best of these, a 40-minute drive from Arinsal. Pas de la Casa, once the venue for the European Championships, is 1½ hours' away on the French frontier. A new station, Arcalis, is just an hour's drive away. Ski passes to all these resorts are available on a daily basis.

### Specialty for children

If you're a bit young — or frightened — to take with you on the slopes, a free kindergarten is available at Arinsal for ages 1-6 years. Trained, English-speaking staff will look after children all day, so you can ski happily in the knowledge that they are made out of harm's way. In the evenings, a babysitter can be arranged through your ski rep Miles, for about £1 an hour.

### Is there life after skiing?

The answer is, emphatically, yes. During the day, you'll find plenty of places to eat

and drink on the mountain. At the bottom, the Asteros restaurant dispenses atmosphere and tapas; at the top you can go self-service at Paroarama, with a three-course meal costing around £3. In between, you can stop off at the Refuge for a Catalan meal simply but excellently prepared at £3 per head, or the new snack bar at the top of the drag lift.

In the evening you can choose from a number of good restaurants and discos in the quaint, mediaeval village of Arinsal (a couple of miles away from Ski Jeannie accommodation at Prats Sobirans) and neighbouring La Massana. We recommend the Hotel Costes de Gibbera for the best wine list in Andorra, Casa No No for lively atmosphere and good music, where there is a restaurant, bar and disco open till 3 am or later for those whose legs can stand it. For a good meal at around £7 per person, head for the family-owned Jan restaurant, or the Hostal Xalet, run by a French family. Slightly more expensive at £10 a head is Borda del Avi, nicknamed Grandad's Barn. Transport to and from the village can be arranged by Miles.

### Take a break from the slopes

The main attraction for skiers and non-skiers alike is the capital, Andorra la Vella, worth a day out just to sock up on duty-free for the journey home. There is a regular bus service to the capital. Fares are ridiculously cheap. Or why not hire a car for £15 a day and take in some of the other charming little towns in the principality, with their historical architecture and magnificent settings. You can even drive down into Spain, top up your tan by the coast and enjoy a day's golfing!

## Where you'll stay in Arinsal

### Prats Sobrans



### Location

Near Jeannie's accommodation is built by the best in Arinsal. Prats Sobrans is an exclusive development just 500 metres from the base of the main chairlift. You literally cannot get any closer to the slopes, unless you're inhabiting the cosy log cabin atmosphere of the Astoria restaurant, also a convenient 500 metres away. Prats Sobrans is two miles from the village of Arinsal, with the attractive La Massana a little further (e.g. down the valley). Transport is available to and from the village.

### Accommodation

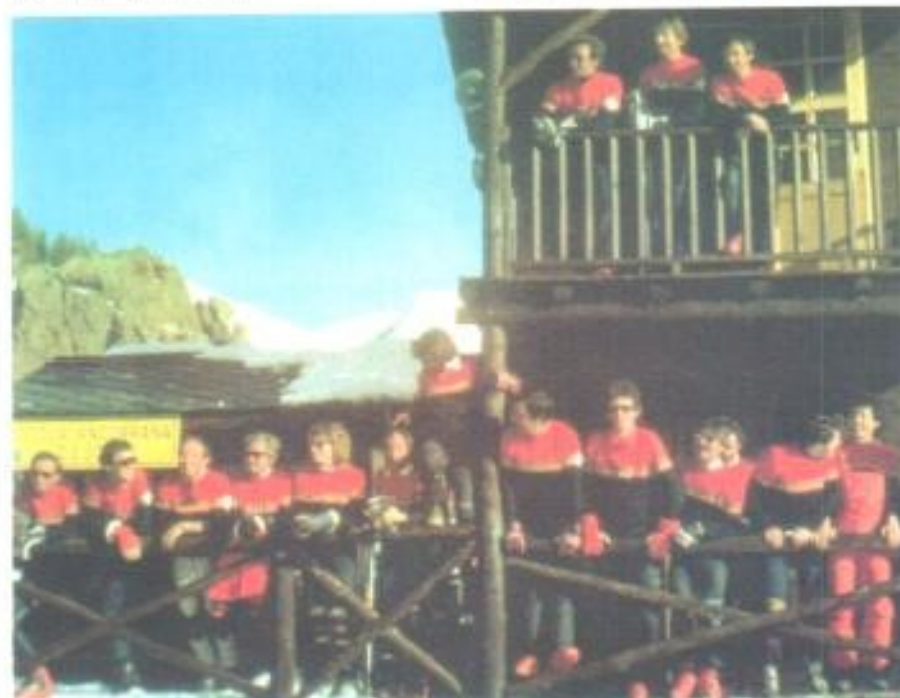
Prats Sobrans is an attractive group of four 5-storey apartment buildings which look out over spectacular views. Recently completed, such care has been designed to attract maximum sunshine, with individual balconies. Fittings and furnishings are modern and comfortable, with local touches such as an open fireplace and ceramic tiling in the bathrooms. The flats are equipped throughout and supplied with plenty of hot water. A lift operates to each floor. A car garage lives on the ground floor.

### Catered

(each apartment sleeps 6)  
3 twin-bedded rooms

Kitchen with coffee maker and toaster, where guests can make their own drinks

## VERBIER

Verbiere is what skiing is all about: breathtaking scenery, more than 100 miles of piste, with some of the best runs in Europe. It boasts modern Swiss efficiency combined with a traditional village atmosphere. Add a dash of glamour and you can understand why visitors from all over the world have judged Verbiere one of Europe's top three ski centres. Just two hours' drive from Geneva, Verbiere sets the pace for other resorts. Set 1500 metres high in the Quatre Vallées ski area, it is surrounded by a mind-boggling variety of runs, gentle, steep or wooded slopes, powder, moguls, glaciers. You name it, Verbiere has it. Verbiere also has an excellent snow record: from early December through to May, yet it is one of the sunniest resorts in the Alps.



### Friendly village

You can tell how popular Verbiere is by its friendly atmosphere. Decades return again and again, as this in the winter season. Verbiere is like a large club where skiers meet up with old friends every year in the bar to swap yarns and catch up on news. Verbiere sleeps just all standards, so it's an excellent resort for families and groups of varying ability, as well as the advanced skier who will always find some new challenge. Potter about on Lac des Vaux or Savoyennes. Frighten yourself on Mont Gelé (and boast about it afterwards). Take a day's trek off-piste and experience the wild loneliness of the Alps. Or even hire a helicopter for the ultimate experience: high altitude glacier skiing.

### Petits Quins Quins

(Sleeps 4 to 10) Telephone (026) 7 66 77



#### Location

The chalet is situated in its own ground off Rue de la Tazette, just five minutes' walk from the main lift station at Medran (you can ski down when conditions allow) and three minutes' walk from the bus stop to Savoleyres (station). You can ski home to the drive at the end of the day. The village square, with bars and night life, is a 10 minute walk away.

#### Accommodation

Step off the ski slopes and back to work. With its wood paneling, log fire and delightful bedrooms, Petit Quins Quins has a Thonet atmosphere. Built in 1950 in the traditional Swiss style, the chalet is older than many, yet has all the refinements you would expect in modern Verbier, including central heating.

Petit Quins Quins was a new address for seasons and proved to be popular with guests who were captivated by its old-world charm. We expect this to be which is demanded.

### Tagounatine

(Sleeps 8 to 9) Telephone (026) 7 51 18



#### Location

Tagounatine is ideal for families learning to ski since it's right next door to the nursery slopes at Les Moulins. Situated one third of the way down Châman des Moulins, it's an easy find for lost children — and you can ski almost all the way home at the end of the day. The bus stop for transport to Savoleyres is five minutes' walk. Medran is eight minutes away by skiing down the nursery slopes to the village centre and catching a bus.

#### Accommodation

If you've never been inside a cuckoo clock, this is your chance. Tagounatine's wooden walls, cosy decor and assortment of chunky knick knacks have earned it the nickname The Doll's House.

An open spiral staircase leads off the sitting room to a sleeping area in the loft (fall people, beware of hitting your head on the beams). The chalet is comfortably and charmingly furnished with carpets in all bedrooms, red and white gingham curtains and heart shaped chairs. There's also linings of hot water to soothe skiers' aching bones.

Outside is a sheltered south-facing balcony, ideal for sunbathing, with splendid views across the village. The chalet is split into two levels, each with its own entrance.

### Vanelet

(Sleeps 8 to 9 or 12 to 13) Telephone (026) 7 56 47



#### Location

Vanelet is part of the Terrain des Morts Verts, a ski tow leading away from Rue de l'Église. Appreciate it fully and appreciate this chalet as it's closest of all to Verbier's night life — a short walk from bars and disco — as well as the village square with nearby ski schools and buses to both lift stations. Signposted and Vanelet just 200 yards from the nursery slopes at Les Moulins.

#### Accommodation

With its eye off the busy yellow entrance, inside Vanelet is lively and comfortable, with plenty of wood paneling, a cosy sitting area and a log fire. Two main accommodations is normally offered as a separate self-catering apartment but can be combined with upstairs to make a large chalet party with street-sterling. This unit is more simply furnished.

## Self-catering in Verbier

### Emeraude 425

(Sleeps 4 to 7)

#### Location

The apartment is part of a modern block right next to Medran, the main ski station. All you have to do is whip round the corner and bear the rest of the village to the left. For those whose idea of self-catering is to eat out every night, Emeraude has the added bonus of being situated over one of the best restaurants in town, Au Vieux Verbier.

#### Accommodation

Emeraude is an attractive, well appointed apartment on the fourth floor with split-level sitting room, complete with log fire. An open plan, minimalist gallery runs round the upper floor. All furnishings are modern and stylish. A balcony leads off the sitting room. There's also plenty of storage and cupboard space for well-taken self-caterers. The chalet is more expensive, but its position makes it worth a visit throughout the season.

#### Location

#### Accommodation

This is the downstairs floor of Chalet Vanelet described earlier. The unit is self-contained with its own separate entrance. Simply furnished, it is ideal for a family. A chalet girl lives upstairs, where groups are catered for. She will help out with any problems and also take telephone messages.

#### Note to self-caterers

Additional cleaning can be arranged through your ski rep, for an extra charge. Shops will deliver wine and groceries to your accommodation.

## Skiing in Verbier

There are two principal ski stations in Verbier: Méribel and Les Fauces. Both areas provide a wide range of pistes on both north and south-facing slopes.



## For beginners

Verbier's numerous slopes are close to the centre of the village. Nearly all Ski Jeannie's accommodation is within easy reach. At Lac des Vaux, on the Méribel side, the snow is always good and the runs are short and easy. There are wide 'toes' so you're not likely to bump into less lucky people.

## For intermediate skiers

Ski Jeannie offers good easy ski runs like the Arpion and Saxon, as well as more testing runs on the other side, taking you down to the village of La Fornaz (you can find good food at the Café de La Fornaz, or at La Marmotte) on the Verbier side. The slopes at Verbier run range from easy to tough, so that as you gain more confidence you can try more a combination of runs. On the Méribel side, Les Fauces is the 'Lullaby' section, with many lifts offering a range of views from Tertin and Mont Gelé to the adventuresome Lac des Vaux.

## For advanced skiers

Mont Gelé and Mont Fort provide some of the best skiing in Europe. Mont Gelé is off-piste, steep, wild and exhilarating. Mont Fort provides exciting high altitude glacier skiing in near perfect conditions. Take the lift from Tertin to Col des Germines and then, before the lift up to Mont Fort (opened last February).

If you want a hard day's skiing get up early to go on the Haute Vallées. Once you've negotiated Tertin the rest is easy, but there's a lot of ground to cover so keep moving.

## Skiing in different directions

Other types of skiing are also available through the Swiss Ski School in Verbier. Individual lessons can be arranged privately, at no extra charge for all standards, men, women, morning and afternoon. You can also try glacier skiing by plane or helicopter.

## Note for non-skiers

For watersports enthusiasts who don't like skiing, a major event occurs this Christmas with the opening of a brand new sports centre in Verbier. Five minutes' walk from the village square, in Rue de la Praline, it boasts indoor swimming pool, tennis and squash courts, sauna, whirlpool and indoor ice rink all under one roof.

## Note for children

Verbier runs a ski nursery for children from 3-10 years old. The cost starts at 23 SF for a half day without lunch and goes up to 175 SF for six full days. Included in the price are ski lessons, baby lift, lunch with drink, play room and dormitory. In the evenings, babysitting can be arranged through our rep Jonathan.

## Improve your skiing the intensive way

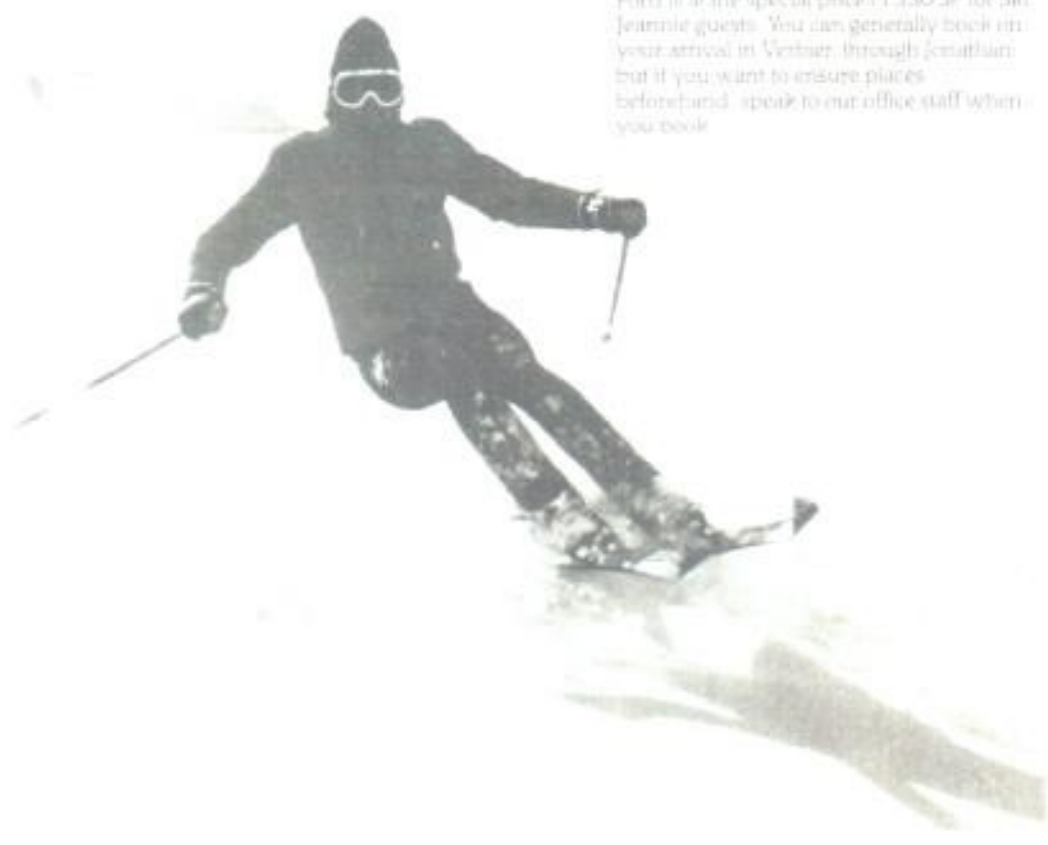
If you're really keen to make headway with your skiing, and you've plenty of energy, the **Cours de Godille** is a hardworking course for skiers of all standards.

Instruction by members of the Swiss Ski School in Verbier, is from 9.30 am to 4.30 pm each day, for a week.

Courses run only in the low season, there are two in December (4th and 11th), three in January (8th, 15th and 22nd), two in March (18th and 25th). The last is on April 1.

You may like to consider these dates when booking your chalet holiday. If you're planning to go to Verbier for two weeks, why not spend a week getting fit and then do the course?

Cost, which includes lift pass (with Mont Fort) is at the special price of 130 SF for Ski Jeannie guests. You can generally book on your arrival in Verbier, through Jonathan, but if you want to ensure places beforehand, speak to our office staff when you book.

## Travel arrangements

### By air

Ski Jeannie prices include your return air fare from Gatwick to Geneva (Verbier) or Toulouse (Anderried) plus the coach transfer from the airport to your resort. All flights depart on Saturday. Scheduled flights are available on request.

### By coach

We have also arranged alternative transport from London to Verbier by coach, giving you an extra day's skiing. Coach leaves London from the Great Western Road, Paddington Station on Friday afternoon, travelling throughout the night to reach Verbier on Saturday morning. Coach tickets will have your equipment and ski passes ready by midday for you to use that afternoon. At the end of your holiday you will leave Verbier at 4pm Saturday, arriving in London Sunday morning. Transport is by luxury coach, with the majority of seats converting to billy seats. All coaches are fitted with TV. Videos will be shown during the journey and there are individual reading lights.
