




Verbier is, in our view, an exceptionally pleasant resort with a great many advantages. The easy drive from Geneva Airport takes only about three hours. The village is high and, being situated in an open bowl, enjoys long hours of sunshine. The views, particularly towards the Mont Blanc range, are mag-nificent. The atmosphere is relaxed and informal, with traditional style chalets still predominating over hotels and newer apartment houses. There are excellent open sunny nursery slopes, one of which is entirely devoted to classes for young children, and a good value family abonnement is available. The extent and variety of the skiing is remarkable, offering a wide choice to almost every grade of skier. The most popular area includes the snow fields around Les Ruinettes, Attelas and Lac des Vaux and some testing runs down to Tortin and off the top of Mont-Gelé. The other main area centres around Savoleyres and offers open south facing slopes back to Verbier and north facing wooded runs down to La Tzoumazfavourite rendez-vous at lunch time. A minibus service, included in the ski pass, connects the departure stations for these two main areas and the runs interlink so you can also circulate from one to the other on skis. All in all a great variety, almost guaranteed to give you a great holiday. Add to that lunch in the sun at Le Carrefour restaurant, inter-chalet parties at tea time and in the evenings, plenty of fellow English guests, a lively bar at the Hotel Eden, a good discotheque at the Farm Club and dancing to groups at Tara's and Marshall's night clubs—and surely you can't fail to enjoy Verbier !
